

What happens if battery acid gets into your mouth?

Can you put a battery in your mouth?

Never put batteries in your mouth, to test, to hold, or for any reason. They are slippery and easily swallowed. Don't mistake batteries for pills. Don't store batteries near pills or in pill bottles. Don't leave them on bedside tables or place them loose in your pocket or purse.

How do you neutralize battery acid in your mouth?

If the acid is present in the mouth, you can neutralize the acid with a solution of baking soda and water. To do this, mix a teaspoon of baking soda with a cup of water and swish it around in your mouth. Do not vomit if battery acid is ingested. Give milk or water immediately. What happens if you eat a dry cell battery?

When an alkaline dry cell battery is ingested, it may result in signs and symptoms such as burning in the mouth and throat, difficulty swallowing, and pain in the ears, nose, and eyes. If the dust, smoke or burning fumes are inhaled, the symptoms may include coughing, shortness of breath, and irritation of the respiratory tract.
