

New battery has not been charged for 2 years

Can you leave a car battery uncharged for a year?

Not necessarily, but leaving the battery uncharged for a year is not a good idea. **RELATED:** How Long Does It Take To Charge A Car Battery? Car battery can last around 2-3 months without driving. This depends on the condition of the battery, how you so store it, and whether you have a battery trickle charger.

How often should a car battery be charged?

Giving the battery a charge every 12 weeks is a good standard to follow. If you expect your car battery to sit unused for more than a month, you should consider removing the battery and storing it away. This will help reduce wear on your battery and allow it to better hold its charge in the long run. Does idling car drain battery?

Can a car battery take a charge if left on?

Yes. If you run a car battery **DEAD**, for instance by leaving the lights on, it will usually take a charge, but you can bet that you have knocked a few months or a year or two off the life of the battery. Car batteries are not **BUILT** to be deeply discharged.

Can a car battery go bad if left unused?

Yes, car batteries can go bad from sitting. If a battery is left unused for a long period of time, it will slowly lose its charge and eventually die. This is because the chemical reaction inside the battery that produces electricity gradually slows down when it's not being used. What happens if you let your car sit for years?

What happens if you don't use a car battery?

Your car battery will eventually die if you don't drive it regularly. Car batteries are designed to be charged by the alternator as they move along, so if it's sat on your driveway for an extended period of time the electrical systems (such as the alarm) will drain the charge.
