

New battery has not been charged for half a year

Can you leave a car battery uncharged for a year?

Not necessarily, but leaving the battery uncharged for a year is not a good idea. RELATED: How Long Does It Take To Charge A Car Battery? Car battery can last around 2-3 months without driving. This depends on the condition of the battery, how you so store it, and whether you have a battery trickle charger.

How often should a car battery be charged?

Giving the battery a charge every 12 weeks is a good standard to follow. If you expect your car battery to sit unused for more than a month, you should consider removing the battery and storing it away. This will help reduce wear on your battery and allow it to better hold its charge in the long run. Does idling car drain battery?

How long does a car battery last if left unused?

If you know your car battery is relatively new and has been kept in good condition, it can probably sit unused for about two weeks before it goes flat, however in other cases a car battery can last between two weeks to four months. If you've left your car unused for over two weeks, it's quite likely you'll need professional assistance.

Can a car battery take a charge if left on?

Yes. If you run a car battery DEAD, for instance by leaving the lights on, it will usually take a charge, but you can bet that you have knocked a few months or a year or two off the life of the battery. Car batteries are not BUILT to be deeply discharged.

What if a new car battery is not fully charged?

If a new car battery is not fully charged, it doesn't mean it's bad, it's because typically, they came charged around 90% of original capacity from the factory.

What happens if you don't use a car battery?

Your car battery will eventually die if you don't drive it regularly. Car batteries are designed to be charged by the alternator as they move along, so if it's sat on your driveway for an extended period of time the electrical systems (such as the alarm) will drain the charge.
